*By 2035, these existing efficiency measures will **save enough energy to meet the current US energy demand for two full years.**¹ This will save American consumers **\$1.1 trillion dollars.** By 2025, these standards will also reduce annual CO₂ by an amount equal to the emissions of **112 coal fired power plants** – or the pollution from roughly 20% of all **existing American coal plants** each year! This will reduce air pollutants that hurt our public health and the environment. On top of all this, by using less energy, we reduce the need for imports, making our nation more secure.*

WHO WE ARE

ASAP organizes and leads a broad-based coalition effort that works to advance, win and defend new appliance, equipment and lighting energy efficiency measures which deliver large energy, water, consumer, public health and environmental benefits.

Founded by the American Council for an Energy-Efficient Economy, the National Resources Defense Council, the Alliance to Save Energy, and the Energy Foundation, ASAP works with industry to advance energy efficiency measures at a national level that will provide benefits to us all.
